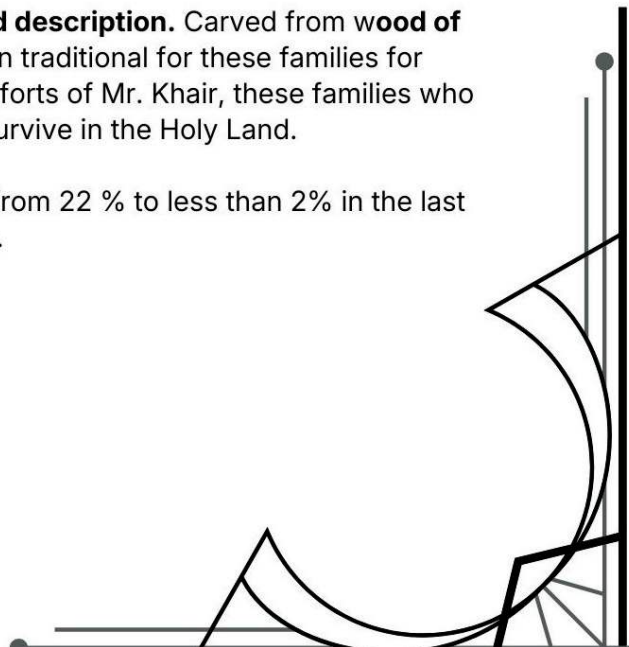

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income and there is no tourism at all. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles.

These **hand carved religious articles are beyond description**. Carved from wood of **the sacred Olive tree**, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income will be able to stay living and survive in the Holy Land.

THE HOLY FAMILY AND THE CALL TO FAITHFUL FAMILY LIFE

The Feast of the Holy Family, celebrated on December 28, invites reflection on the home of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The Church places this family before the faithful as a real household shaped by faith, obedience, and trust in God. Scripture presents a life marked by ordinary duties, real hardship, and steady devotion. This feast highlights how holiness grows within daily family life.

The Gospel according to Luke describes Jesus growing in wisdom and grace under the care of Mary and Joseph. Family life in Nazareth centers on love expressed through responsibility and sacrifice. Mary listens to God and keeps His word close to her heart. Joseph leads through action rather than speech. Matthew's Gospel shows Joseph protecting his family during danger and uncertainty through obedience to God's direction. Catholic teaching consistently presents this household as a guide for Christian families. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches parents serve as the first teachers of faith within the home, forming a domestic church grounded in prayer and example.

The Holy Family faces trials familiar to many families today. Scripture records flight into Egypt, financial strain, and concern for safety. Faith guides each decision. Trust in God shapes responses to fear and instability. The Church lifts up this family to show faithful living does not depend on comfort or perfection. Faithful living grows through perseverance, forgiveness, and daily commitment.

This feast speaks directly to modern family life. Prayer strengthens relationships. Shared meals build connection. Sunday Mass anchors the week. Children learn faith through example rather than instruction alone. Patience during stress reflects trust in God's plan. Through steady acts of love, family life becomes a place where Christ remains present.

The Feast of the Holy Family affirms the value of family life rooted in faith. Every home shapes future disciples. Ordinary choices carry lasting impact. The Holy Family of Nazareth continues to intercede for families, calling each household toward unity, fidelity, and love grounded in truth.

Surviving the Holidays:

As the signs of the holidays start popping up (neighbors' outdoor decorations, Christmas tree stands, Black Friday advertisements, and many more), family caregivers may start feeling overwhelmed and stressed even before December arrives. Managing the holidays while caring for another person places a heavy burden upon caregivers. What can caregivers do to survive the hustle and bustle of the holidays?

A good place to start is to ask oneself, "Just how much energy do I have to participate in all the busy-ness of the holidays?" Some caregivers who are already feeling stressed may realize that they have very little extra energy to focus on the holidays. Other caregivers may find that they are energized by the excitement that the holidays bring, and this excitement may help them manage the holidays comfortably.

In the case of the former, caregivers should conduct an honest assessment of their energy levels. From this assessment they can determine and make plans that are appropriate for the time and energy they have to spare. Once they have done this, they can inform family members and friends so that their expectations can be adjusted.

One approach to surviving the holidays is to think about gifting. Caregivers are constantly giving to their care receivers all through the year. In addition they are also giving their family members the gift of not having to be the main or sole caregiver. This is a huge gift of which many family members may be

totally ignorant and unappreciative. Perhaps December should become the month that family/friends give their time and energy to help family caregivers.

For this gift to happen, caregivers may need to take the initiative. While sharing with their family members and friends the status of their time and energy levels, caregivers can suggest that a wonderful gift for both of them (care receiver and caregiver alike) would be the gift of respite time (breaks for the caregiver). Caregivers can specify what they need. Some possible examples follow:

1. Take the care receiver to lunch or bring lunch to the care receiver.
2. Take the care receiver to doctor and/or physical therapy appointments.
3. Perform household tasks/chores and/or take in vehicle for maintenance/repair appointments.
4. Go shopping, pick up groceries, conduct other errands.
5. Come and spend some time visiting with the care receiver doing some of their favorite activities (going through photo albums, listening to music, working puzzles, watching movies, etc.)
6. Help put up holiday decorations inside the house and outside.



7. Handle the preparations for family gatherings and/or host family gatherings.
8. Help send out holiday cards and purchase holiday gifts.
9. Take the loved one to some holiday activities (concerts, plays, Santa visits, etc.)
10. After the holidays, help take down and store holiday decorations.

The purpose of assessing energy level, developing a list of respite time tasks, and sharing with family members and friends is to open up time for family caregivers to take a break. This is how one survives the holidays – looking after one's needs and engaging in self-care.

Some caregivers are blessed with family and friends who will respond positively to providing gifts of respite time. Unfortunately, some caregivers may find that they do not have such support. In those cases, they may need to utilize community resources such as adult day care centers or contact organizations such as The Alzheimer's Association about receiving respite support. To take care of themselves, caregivers need to find the courage to admit they need support and then ask for it.

As you move through the next few weeks, may you receive gifts of time that will allow you some peaceful, calm moments to enjoy the spirit of the holidays and renew your strength and energy.

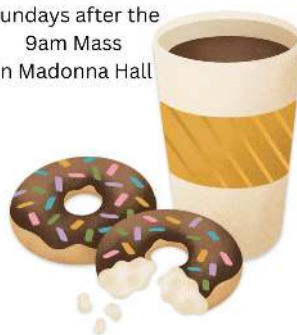

A Formula for Holy Families

“Brothers and sister: Put on, as God’s chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another..”

The Holy Family faced much rejection, persecution and peril from their earliest days. We sometimes find degrees of that within our own families. St. Paul gives us a winning formula for families who are called to be holy. Put on heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and forgiveness. Imagine!

Petition:

That our families may be modeled after the virtues of the Holy Family who withstood great difficulty from the earliest days....

Stewardship: Grace In Action

This Christmas Season, we are invited to ask ourselves:

- **How am I stewarding compassion in my family?**
Do I notice suffering, or rush past it?
- **Where is God calling me to greater patience or humility?**
Especially when it is hardest to give.
- **Is there forgiveness that needs to be offered or received?**
Healing begins when generosity of heart replaces resentment.

These choices may seem small, but they shape holy families and strengthen the Church itself.

The virtues St. Paul names are not beyond our reach. They are garments we are invited to “put on” each day through conscious stewardship of our lives and relationships. When we choose compassion over criticism, patience over frustration, forgiveness over pride, we mirror the love of the Holy Family.

A Practical Stewardship Commitment

As we pray, “That our families may be modeled after the virtues of the Holy Family...”, let us respond with intention:

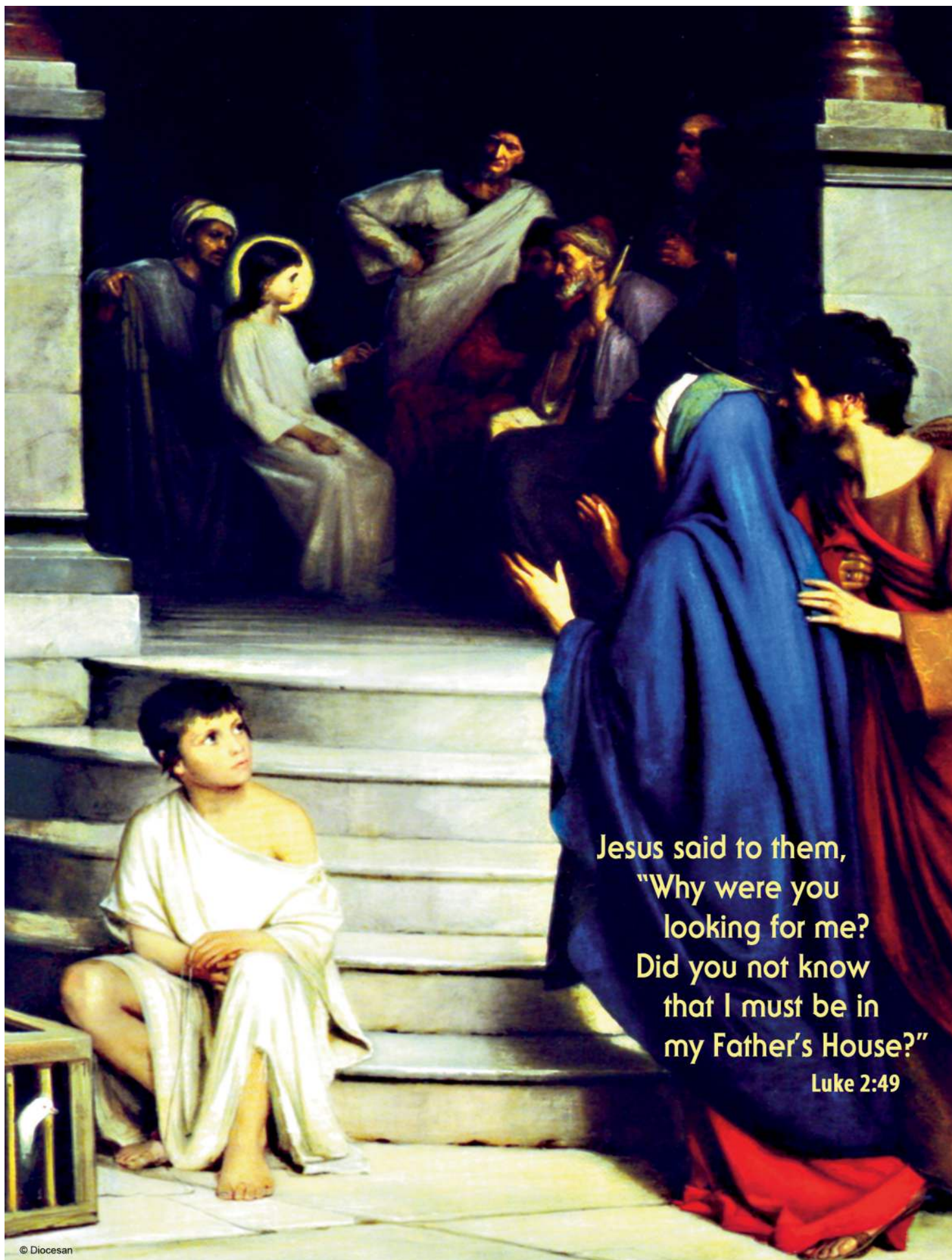
- **Steward your time** by being truly present — listening without distraction, praying together, or sharing a meal with purpose.
