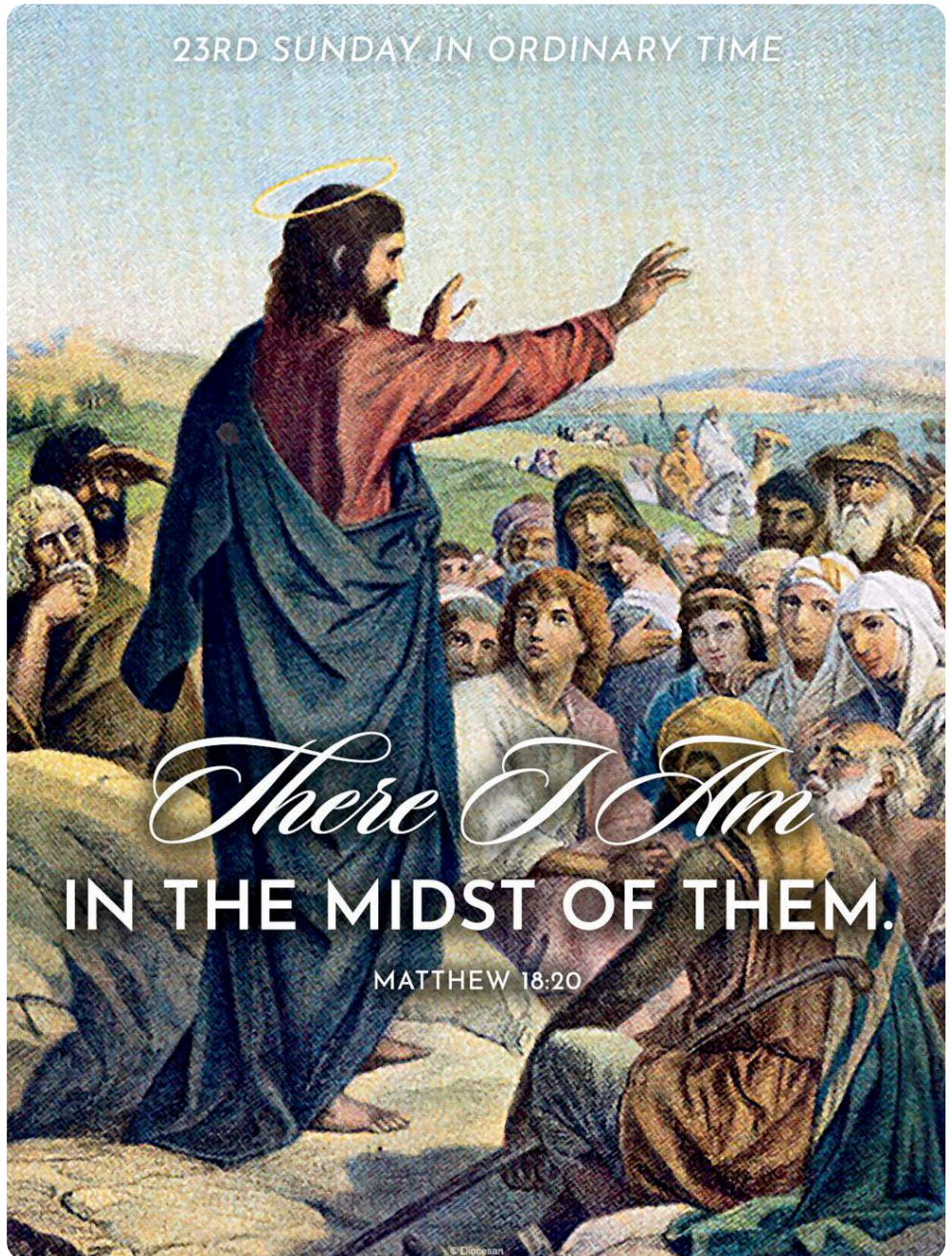

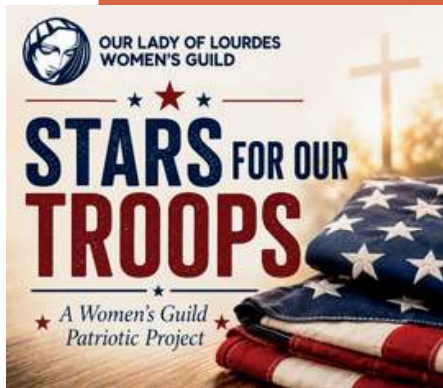

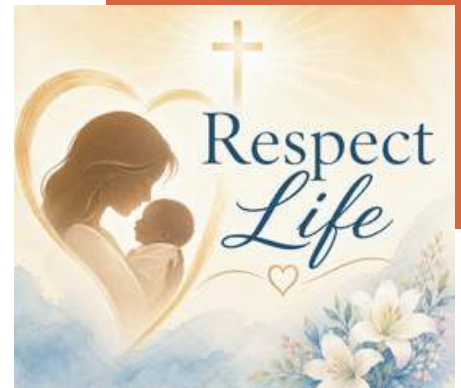
STARS FOR OUR TROOPS

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

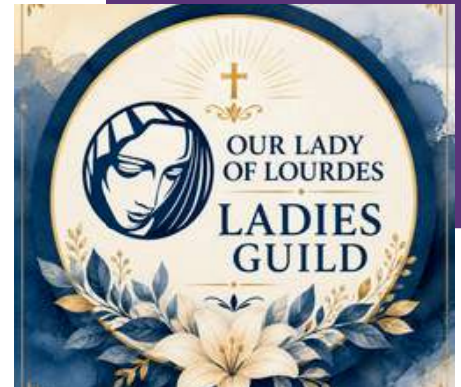

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BEFORE YOU SPEAK ABOUT THEM, SPEAK TO THEM

Jesus gives a direct instruction today: "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone." When someone hurts or frustrates us, complaining to someone else feels easier. Avoiding the person feels safer. Holding resentment feels justified. Jesus asks for a harder, more charitable path.

Speaking directly should never aim at winning or proving ourselves right. Correction meant to embarrass or shame someone misses the point. The goal is reconciliation, honesty, and protecting the other person's dignity. This applies to family life, friendships, work, and parish life. Small hurts grow larger when we talk about someone instead of talking to them. Silence and gossip both damage trust. Reconciliation starts with one honest, private conversation.

This week, consider someone you need to speak with directly. Consider someone you need to forgive, or approach with more patience. Choose the harder conversation. Choose love.

These prayers take approx. 15 min; no need to sign up, just come in and join us. We have prayer booklets to follow.





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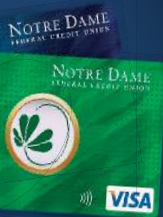
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09 • THE WEIGHT OF DISCIPLESHIP



WHEN LOVE REQUIRES THE HARD CONVERSATION

Jesus gives a clear instruction in today's Gospel: "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone." The command sounds simple, but living out this teaching proves difficult. When someone hurts us, our first instinct rarely points toward a private, honest conversation. We avoid the person. We complain to a friend instead of speaking directly to the one who hurt us. We hold resentment quietly for weeks or months. Or we wait, hoping the other person makes the first move. Jesus offers His disciples a different path.

Christian correction does not aim at winning an argument or proving ourselves right. This teaching has nothing to do with embarrassing someone or listing every fault we notice in others. Real correction begins with love and a genuine desire for reconciliation. Jesus tells us to approach the person privately first, because the goal here is restoring a relationship, not damaging a reputation. Public accusation rarely heals a wound. A public complaint often protects our own pride more than the other person's dignity. Private, honest conversation gives both people room to listen, respond, and change.

This Gospel speaks directly to ordinary life in our parish and our families. We will disappoint, misunderstand, offend, and frustrate one another. This happens in marriages, friendships, families, workplaces, ministries, and parish communities. No family stays free of tension. No parish community avoids every hurt feeling. Following Christ does not remove conflict from our lives. Following Christ changes how we handle the conflict when conflict comes.

Peace and avoidance differ from each other. Peace does not mean pretending nothing happened. Silence often protects our own comfort, not the relationship. Sometimes love requires honest words, spoken directly to the person involved. Other times, spiritual maturity means forgiving a small offense quickly, before resentment grows into something bigger than the original hurt. Pray for wisdom to know the difference between these two callings.

The first reading from Ezekiel 33 adds weight to this Gospel message. God tells the prophet he carries responsibility to warn others of danger, and silence in the face of danger carries real consequences. Scripture challenges the idea of a private, personal faith alone. Christians carry responsibility toward one another. We are called to care about another person's spiritual good enough to speak honestly when needed, always acting with humility and charity rather than judgment. Correction offered without humility becomes cruelty. Correction offered with love becomes a gift.

Near the end of this passage, Jesus makes a promise: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Christ remains present at the center of our relationships, our disagreements, our forgiveness, and every attempt at reconciliation. We never face conflict alone. Christ walks with us through the hardest conversations.

This week, consider someone you have avoided instead of approaching honestly. Consider someone you have spoken about rather than speaking to directly. Consider someone you need to forgive, or someone from whom you need to ask forgiveness. Bring this relationship to prayer. Ask the Lord directly: "Lord, what would love require of me here?"

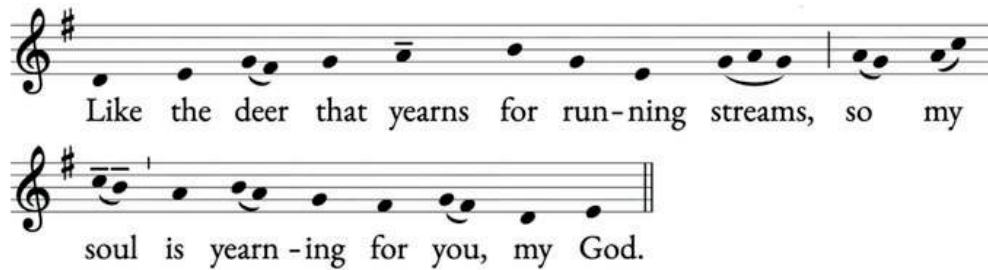

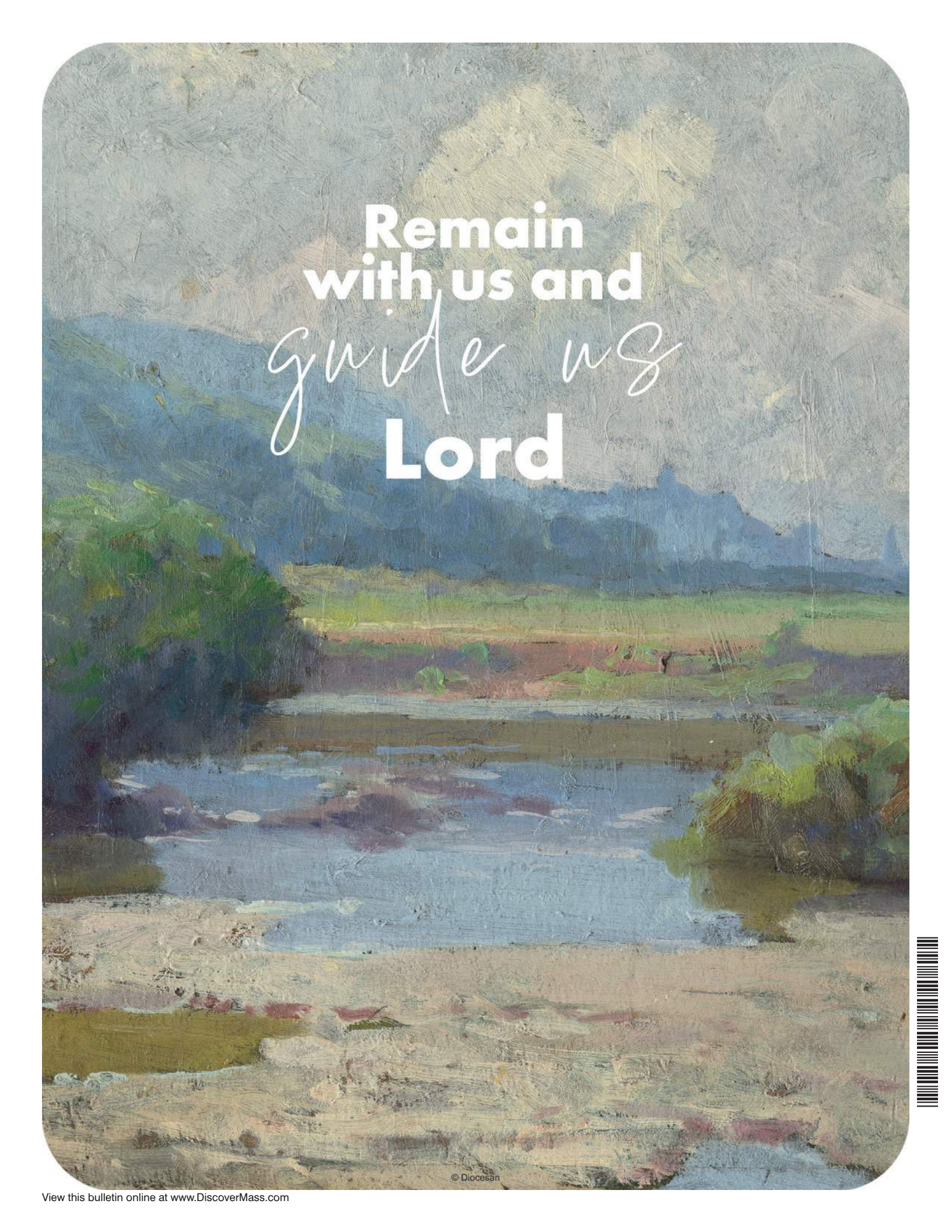
