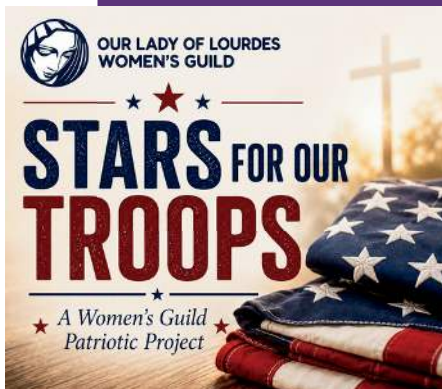
SAFE ENVIRONMENT IS STILL DUE!

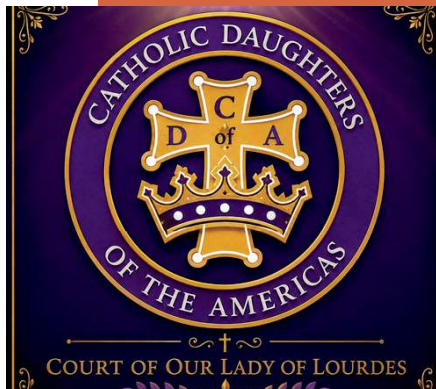
RESPECT LIFE: THANK YOU

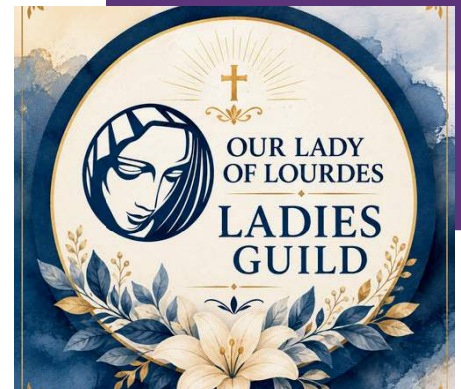
ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

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STOP KEEPING SCORE

Peter asks Jesus a question we understand well: "How often must I forgive?" Beneath the question is another one: When have I done enough?

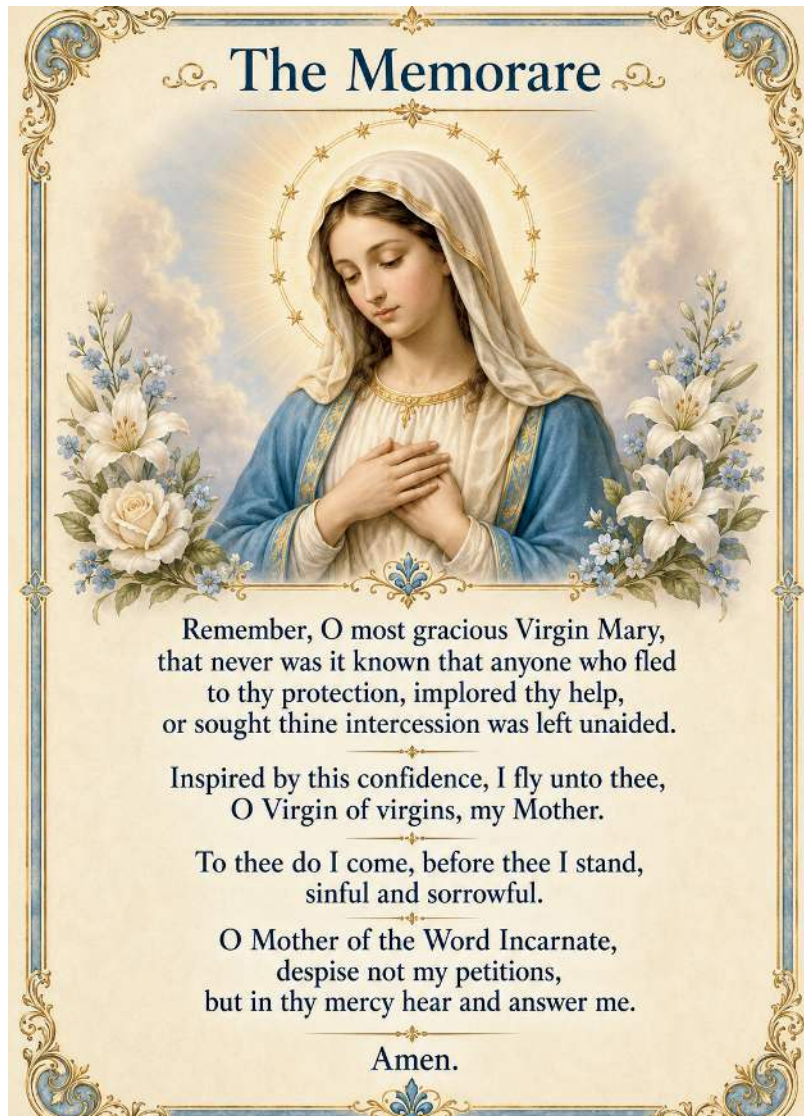
We keep score more often than we admit. We remember who apologized first, how many chances we have given, how deeply we were hurt, and whether the other person has "earned" our mercy. But Jesus refuses to give Peter a convenient limit. Forgiveness is not about counting offenses. It is about becoming more like God.

That does not mean pretending the hurt was small, excusing bad behavior, or allowing someone to keep harming us. Forgiveness and trust are not the same thing, and sometimes healthy boundaries are necessary. Forgiveness also does not require us to erase the memory of what happened. We may still remember the wound, even after we have chosen not to hold it against another.

Forgiveness is often a decision before it is a feeling. The hurt may remain for a time, but we can still choose mercy and ask God to heal what remains.

The servant in today's Gospel is forgiven an enormous debt, yet he refuses to show the same mercy to another. Jesus invites us to remember how much mercy we ourselves have received—and how freely God continues to offer it.

This week, consider the scorecard you may still be carrying. Is there a name, an argument, or an old hurt you keep revisiting? Ask God for the grace to choose mercy over resentment. Forgiveness may not change the past or erase the memory, but it can free us from the desire to keep punishing someone for it.

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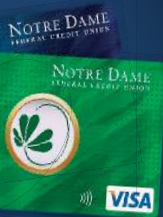
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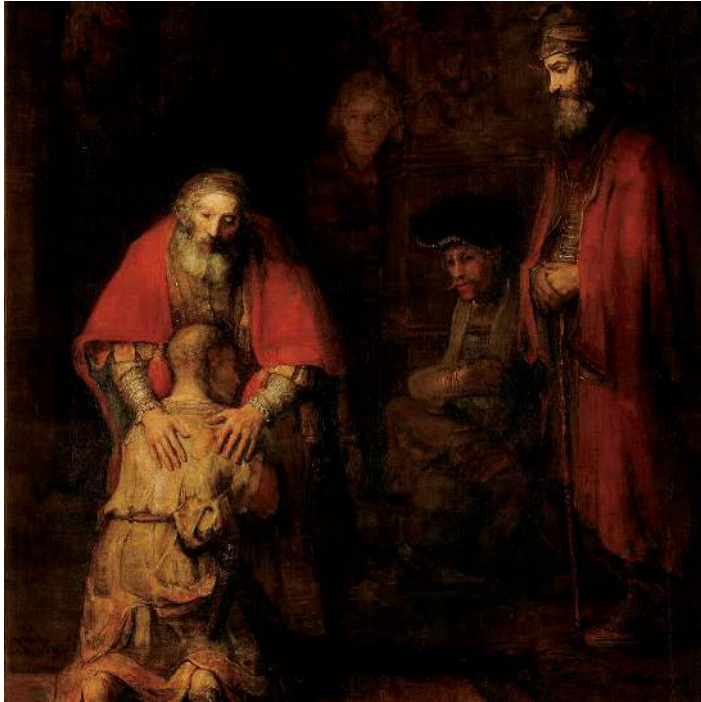

WHEN FORGIVENESS FEELS IMPOSSIBLE

Some wounds are easy to move past. Others stay with us. A harsh word from someone we love, a betrayal we never expected, or an injustice that was never acknowledged can remain in the heart for years. We may know that Jesus calls us to forgive, yet still wonder, How am I supposed to forgive this?

In this Sunday's Gospel, Peter asks Jesus how many times he must forgive someone who sins against him. Peter suggests seven times. Jesus responds, "seventy-seven times." He is not giving Peter a larger number to count. He is telling him to stop counting altogether.

That sounds beautiful until forgiveness becomes personal.

Christian forgiveness does not mean pretending that what happened did not hurt. It does not require us to call something good that was wrong. Forgiving someone does not restore trust, erase consequences, or mean that boundaries are unnecessary. Forgiveness is not the denial of a wound. It is a decision about what we will do with that wound.

When we refuse to forgive, we can begin carrying the offense everywhere we go. We replay conversations, imagine what we should have said, wait for an apology, or hope the other person feels the pain we felt. Before long, someone else's action is still shaping our heart long after the moment itself has passed.

Jesus offers another way.

In the parable, a servant owes his king a debt so enormous that he could never hope to repay it. The king responds with compassion and forgives everything. Yet that same servant encounters someone who owes him far less and refuses to show the mercy he has just received. The tragedy is that he has forgotten his experience of mercy.

That is where Christian forgiveness begins: not with the worthiness of the person who hurt us, but with the mercy God has already given us.

Every one of us stands before God with a debt we could never repay on our own. Still, He meets repentance with mercy. He restores us through grace. The Cross reveals just how far God is willing to go to reconcile us to Himself.

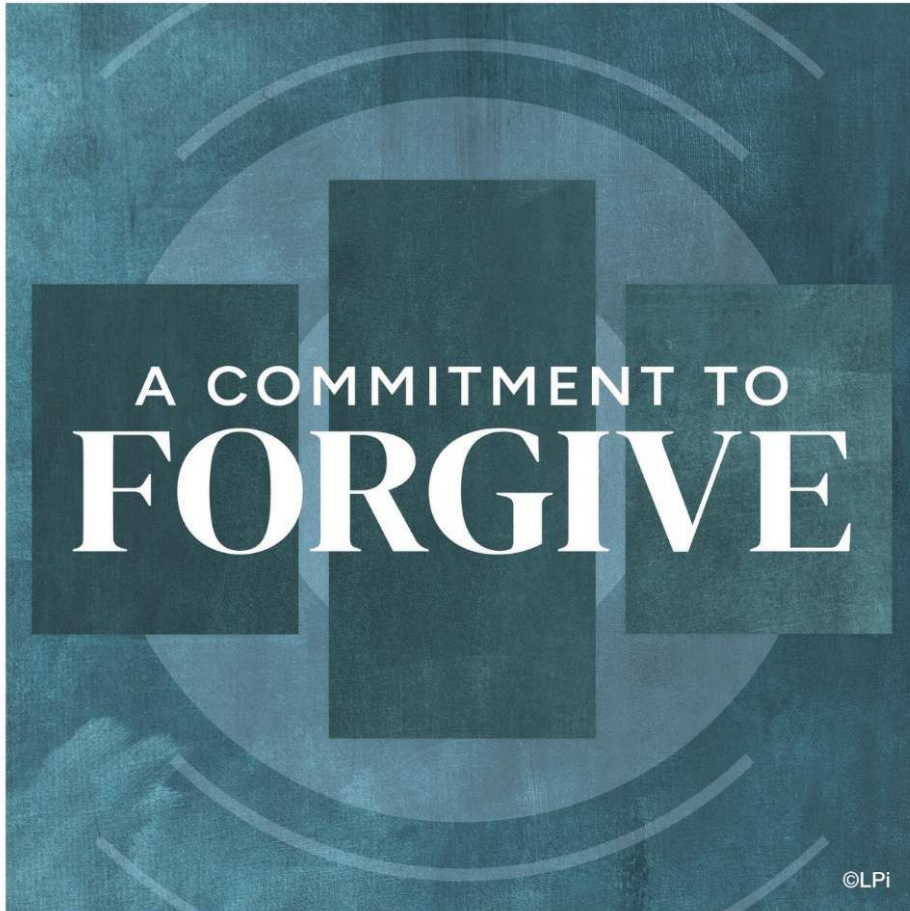
Remembering that mercy does not make wounds suddenly easy to forgive. Sometimes forgiveness is not a single moment but a repeated choice. We may forgive someone today and feel the anger return tomorrow. That does not mean we failed. It may mean that healing is still taking place.

At times, the honest prayer we can offer is, "Lord, I want to forgive, but I do not know how." We can place the person, the pain before Christ and ask Him to do in us what we cannot accomplish by ourselves, and trust Him with whatever still remains unresolved.

Forgiveness does not change the past. But through grace, it can change the power the past has over us.

Perhaps there is someone whose name comes to mind as you read this. You do not have to erase what happened or pretend the wound is gone. But you can begin by placing it into the hands of Jesus. This week, ask Him for one simple grace: Lord, teach me to forgive as I have been forgiven.

Gospel Meditation

In my parish, there was once a new employee who frequently told me she was sorry for various imperfections in her work. It could be a little tiring. I finally told her, “You know, you don’t have to say ‘sorry’ so often.” She looked me right in the eyes and said, “Father, you’re right. I’m sorry.” Her ear-to-ear grin betrayed that she enjoyed the irony — and that she would keep asking for forgiveness as often as she needed it.

The Gospel reading this week proclaims to us that God, in Jesus, delights in numerous requests for, and the granting of, forgiveness. To Peter’s question, **“Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?”** Jesus responds, **“I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.”** In other words, Peter, stop counting.

Christian life should be marked by a commitment to frequent forgiveness. God never tires of forgiving us. His limitless love has overcome the power of vengeance, hatred, and division. We tap into that each and every time we ask for forgiveness or extend it to another.

How beautiful our hearts become when they become accustomed to frequent forgiveness! How joyful and attractive become our marriages, families, and parish communities! How light our souls feel when unburdened by the habit of keeping score.

Challenge: Name one thing, small or large, for which you could ask forgiveness from someone in your life. Then do it.

Why Do We Do That?

Catholic Life Explained

Question

Why can't everyone who wants to receive Communion, receive Communion at Mass?

Answer

Outside of the Church, many organizations have all sorts of requirements for membership: dues, achievements, professional standings, etc. The requirements bring the group together in common purposes and goals. Within the Church, there are also basic "requirements" for receiving the sacraments. As Catholics, we believe that the Eucharist is the true "Bread of Life." It is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving Jesus. Out of reverence for Christ, only those in union with this teaching and in a state of grace should receive communion. As Catholics, we should abstain from communion if we are in mortal sin.

While we share many articles of faith with our Protestant brothers and sisters, their understanding of this teaching is fundamentally different. For most non-Catholic churches, they do not believe that Christ becomes truly present in the Eucharist. As such, they should not receive communion in a Catholic Church. These differences are greater for people of non-Christian faiths, and even more apparent for those who do not believe in God. Receiving communion is not a right, but a gift to be accepted in humble, trusting faith.

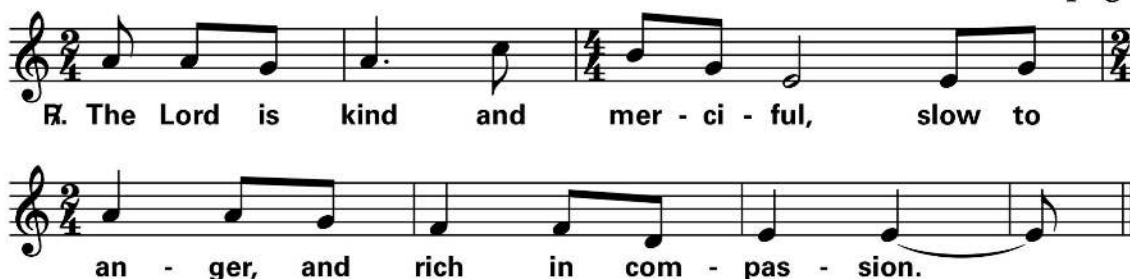

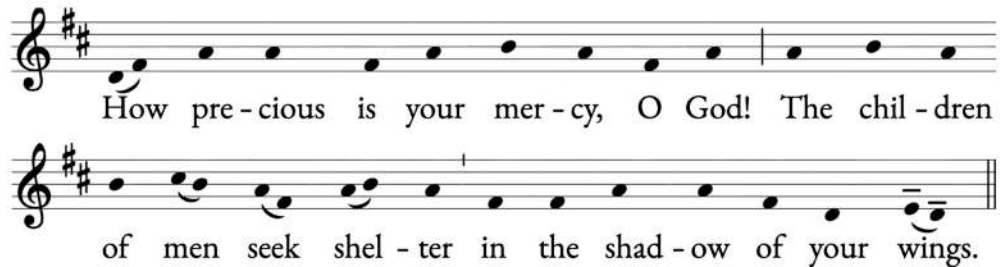
