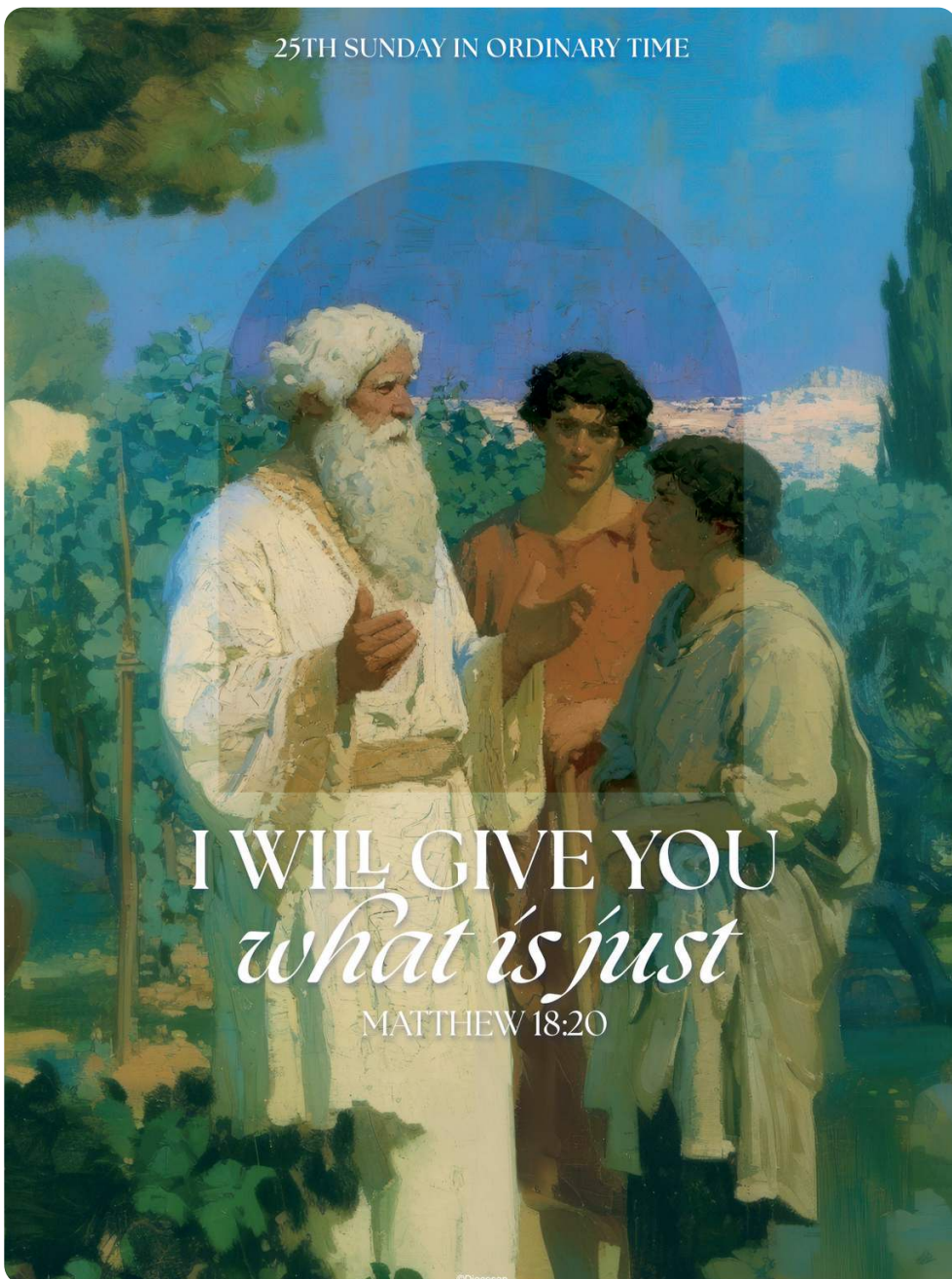

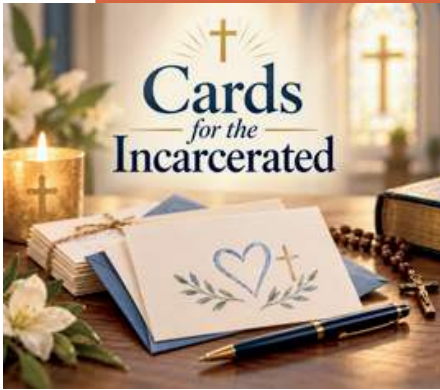

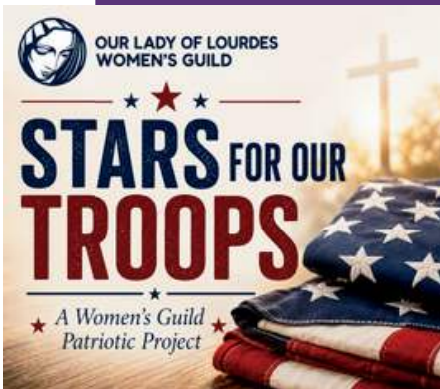
SAFE ENVIRONMENT IS STILL DUE!

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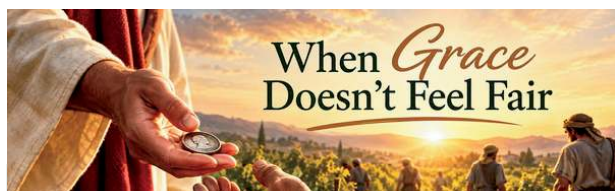
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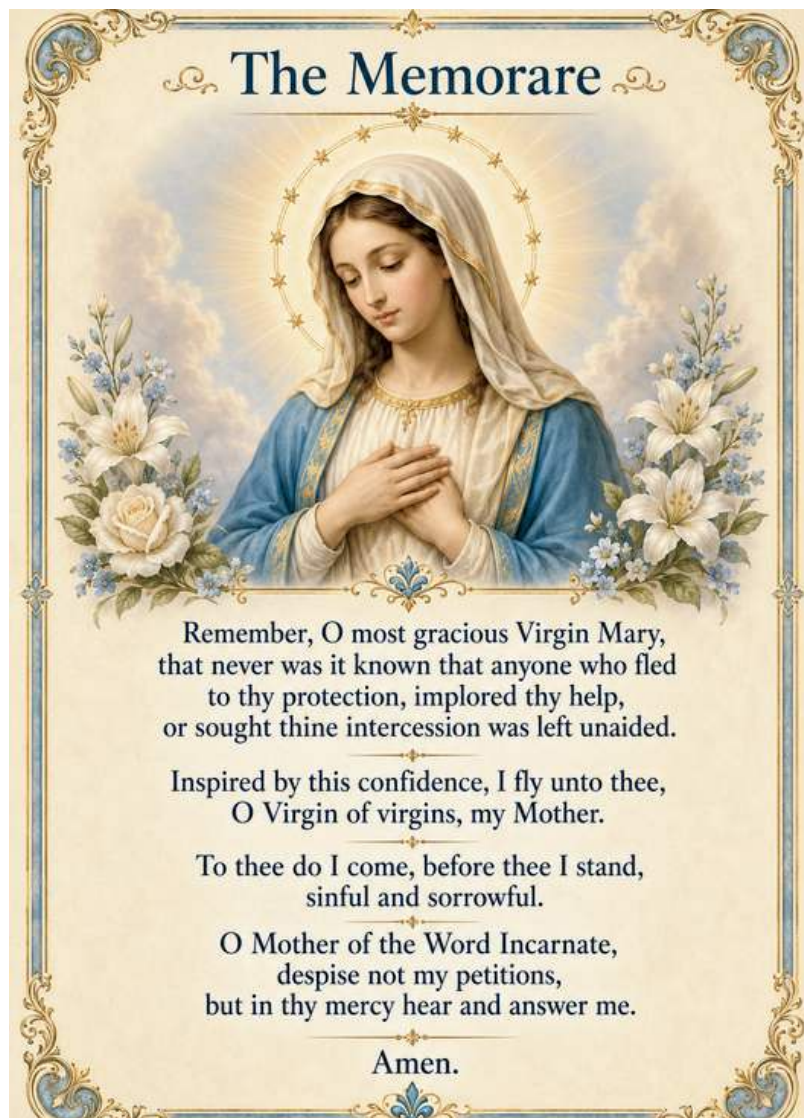
There is something uncomfortable about this Sunday's Gospel. The workers who entered the vineyard at dawn labor through the heat of the day. Others arrive much later, some with only an hour remaining. Yet when evening comes, every worker receives the same denarius.

At first, the complaint of those who worked all day seems reasonable. But Jesus is not really teaching us about wages. The denarius points toward something far greater: eternal life. God desires to give the same ultimate gift—life with Him forever—to the person who has followed Him faithfully for decades and to the sinner who turns back to Him near the end of life.

That can challenge us. Can we truly rejoice when God's mercy seems more generous than we think someone deserves? The workers who arrived first forgot that the denarius was already an extraordinary gift. They had not been cheated. Their mistake was allowing another person's reward to make their own seem smaller. Heaven does not become less glorious because someone else receives it too. God's generosity is not unfair; it reveals a mercy so abundant that every repentant soul is invited to share the same Kingdom.

Yet this Gospel is not permission to postpone conversion. We know the promised reward, but we do not know how much of the day remains. If you have followed Christ for years, remain faithful and rejoice whenever another soul enters the vineyard. If you have wandered far from Him, do not believe it is too late.

The landowner is still calling, and the gift He offers is greater than anything we could ever earn: eternal life with Him.

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REFLECTIONS FROM THE GROTTO • 09



IT IS NOT TOO LATE TO ENTER THE VINEYARD

THE GOD WHO KEEPS CALLING

One of the most hopeful details in this Sunday's Gospel can easily be overlooked: the landowner keeps going back. He goes out at dawn looking for workers, then again at nine, noon, three, and finally near the end of the day. He is still searching for people to enter his vineyard.

Jesus gives us an image of a God who does not stop calling. We sometimes imagine our spiritual lives as though there were a deadline for becoming the person God intended us to be. We look backward and see wasted years, missed opportunities, sins we regret, prayers we neglected, or moments when God was calling and we did not respond. Eventually, we may begin believing that we are too late.

But that is not the God revealed in this Gospel. The landowner is still walking through the marketplace at the final hour. God is still calling. His invitation reaches us even after years of hesitation, regret, or distance. He does not ask us to recover lost time before coming to Him; He simply asks us to respond now.

THE INVITATION REMAINS

That does not mean our choices are unimportant. Scripture urges us not to postpone conversion. Isaiah tells us to seek the Lord while He may be found and turn toward the God who is generous. Repentance is possible because God has not stopped inviting us.

Perhaps you have been Catholic your entire life but realize your relationship with Christ has become routine. The invitation remains. Perhaps you have spent years carrying resentment that needs to be surrendered. Perhaps Confession has been avoided for months or decades. The invitation remains. There may be someone you need to forgive, a habit to leave behind, a ministry you feel called to join, or a prayer life you keep promising yourself you will begin. The landowner is still calling.

His generosity reminds us that grace is not earned by seniority. The workers who came first were not wrong to labor faithfully, but they were wrong to resent the master's goodness toward those who arrived later. God's gift is not diminished because someone else receives it.

WELCOME THOSE WHO ARRIVE LATER

That lesson matters in parish life. Those who have served can unintentionally see the Church as belonging more to them than to someone who just arrived. Yet every conversion should be a reason for joy. Every person returning to Mass, approaching the Sacraments, entering OCIA, joining a ministry, or taking a step toward Christ shows that God is still calling.

The Church is filled with people who entered the vineyard at different hours. Some were raised in the faith, some wandered and returned, and some discovered Christ later. What unites us is not when we arrived, but the One who called us.

If you have labored in the vineyard for years, keep going and welcome those arriving. If you feel too much of the day has passed, hear the Gospel: Christ has not written you off. There is mercy, holiness, and a place for you in His vineyard.

God is still calling. The question is whether we will answer.

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the landowner who pays all of the workers of his vineyard a just daily wage, reminding them that "the last will be first and the first will be last."

The Why

Sometimes, the Gospel takes everything you think you know about Jesus, throws it in a box, shakes it violently, dumps it on the floor, looks you in the eye and says: "Clean it up."

And there you are, picking up the pieces, wondering how, after 2,000 years, someone can still keep you guessing.

Today is one of those Gospels. We know Jesus as a champion of the poor. We envision him as a social justice warrior. And now he's advocating for time theft in the workplace? Make it make sense.

Well, at its heart, today's Gospel is a story about who gets what. A story about comparison, which we are told is the thief of joy — but without comparison, nothing would ever get done. In this world, wages are set, court cases are settled, international borders are drawn, all by comparing one entity to another and evaluating that comparison to make a judgment.

What this Gospel doesn't tell us is the "why." The workers who labored longest in the vineyard feel

cheated because those who showed up later earn the same wage. This would be egregious — unless we consider that the only criteria used in the comparison is the length of the work day's duration. Quality and efficiency of work is never even mentioned. For all we know, those all-day workers could have been standing around fanning themselves, and should feel lucky to get what they did.

"Why" is a question we ask a lot in this life. Why did my dad die? Why did I get cancer? Why did my husband lose his job? As we pick up the pieces of today's Gospel, we should ask ourselves this: when we know what we know about Who decides who gets what, do we have to know the "why?"

RESPECT LIFE: WHAT ARE ABORTION PILLS?

Most abortions are no longer done by surgery in clinics, but by taking pills.

The rate of women taking abortion pills is increasing (and is at hundreds of thousands per year). The first pill (mifepristone) kills preborn babies by cutting them off from blood and oxygen. A second pill (misoprostol) then helps push the babies' remains out. While these drugs can have other uses, they are a deadly combination for preborn children.

In addition to ending the lives of babies, abortion pills are dangerous for the mothers who take them.

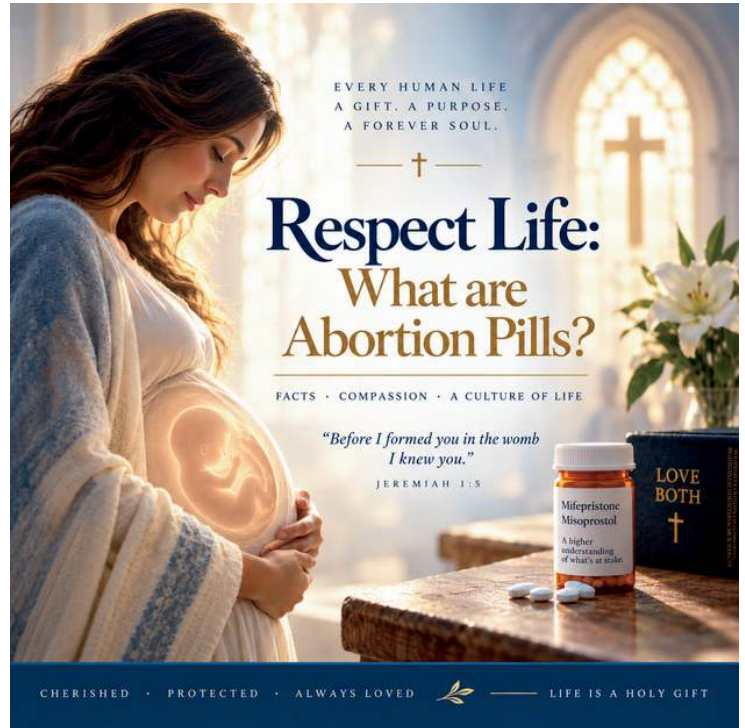
They have been found to cause four times as many complications as surgical abortions. A 2025 study found that 10 percent of women who take abortion pills need to get urgent treatment for problems afterward like infections, hemorrhages, or remains of the baby not having come out. But the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has taken shortcuts over the years and removed guardrails around the pills. This allows the abortion industry to push the abortion pill more and more.

In 2021, the FDA made the abortion pill available even without an in-person doctor visit.

That means a woman might be taking the pill dangerously late in her pregnancy, or during a complicated pregnancy where it would be unsafe, and a doctor wouldn't know. Being able to get abortion pills by "telehealth" video appointment and mailed to your home, or at your local pharmacy, also means abortions are now happening everywhere and anywhere, often with women suffering through the trauma of delivering their dead baby alone.

This easier access to abortion pills also increases the chances of their being used by abusive partners or sex trafficking criminals against a woman's will.

Because abortion pills can be sent through the mail, they are also often being sent from states with pro-abortion laws to women in states with pro-life laws. That means the pro-life states don't have the ability to protect life and women in need like they were supposed to after the Supreme Court finally overturned Roe v. Wade in 2022. Some women who take the first abortion pill may have time to change their mind with an "abortion pill reversal" process, but some states are trying to block access to this last chance for life.



What can you do to help protect women and babies from abortion pills?

1. Pray for women who are deceived by the abortion industry.
2. Share the risks of the abortion pill with your friends.
3. Sign up for Respect Life Prayer and Action to help protect women and babies from these dangerous drugs at respectlife.org/prayer-and-action.

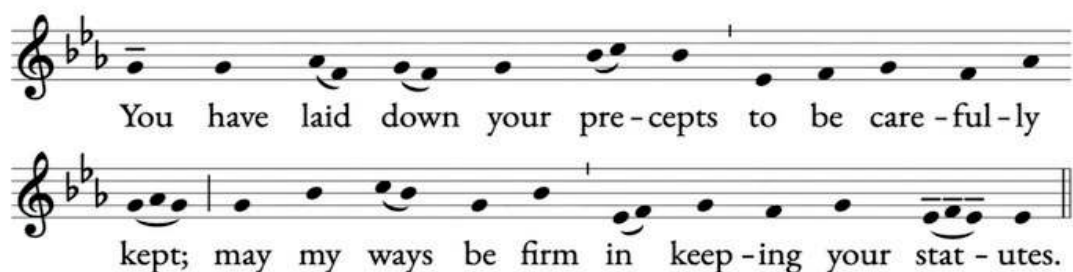

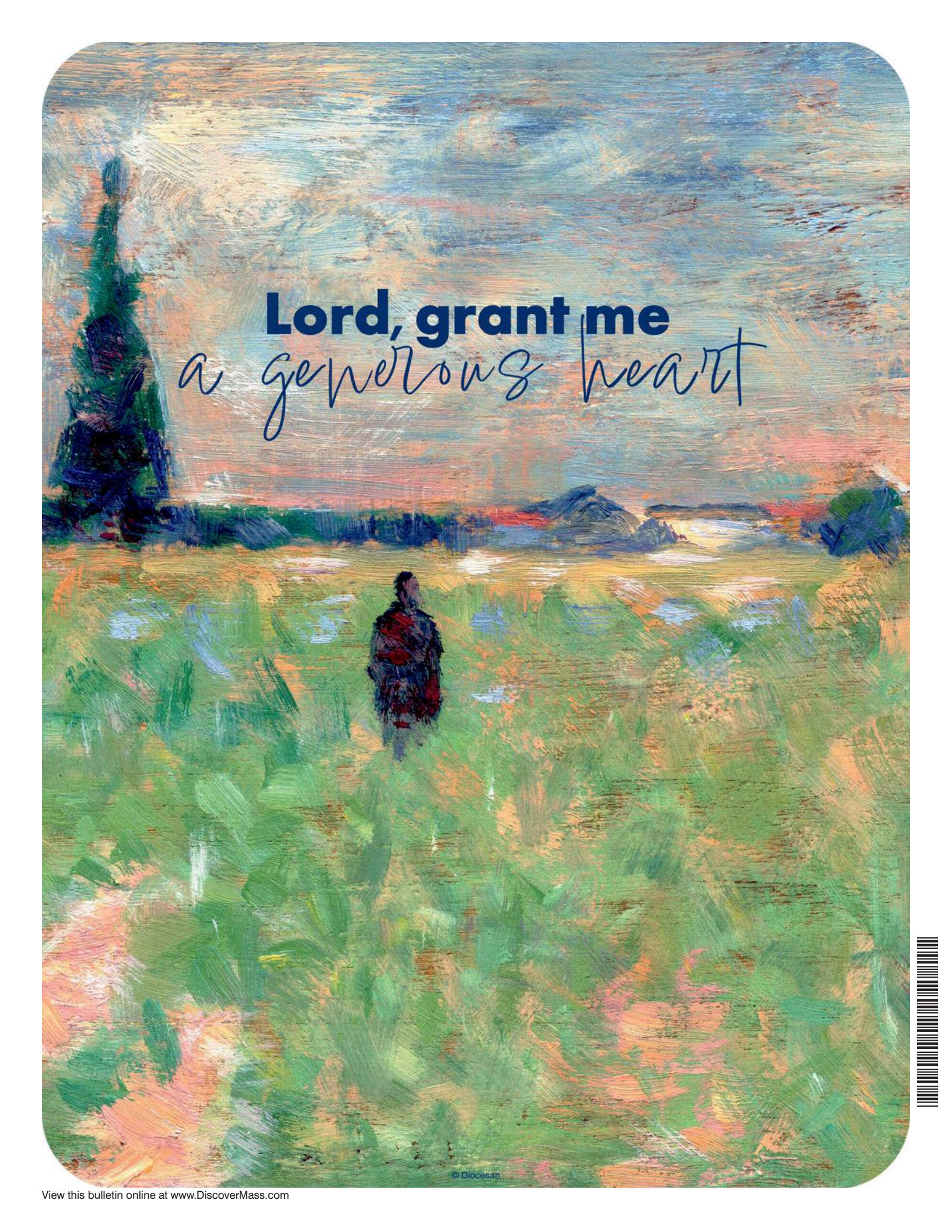
